

Combustible (burnable) Waste

Disposal Sites

Waste collection sites in each area Chita-nanbu Regional Environmental Center (Transfer Station)

Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town)

How to Dispose

Waste collection sites in each area

Place waste in town-designated trash bags and dispose of it at the designated waste collection sites in each area on the specified combustible (burnable) waste collection day.

Disposable diapers do not need to be placed in designated trash bags. Instead, place them in a transparent or semi-transparent bag and label it [紙おむつ].


How to Dispose Chita-nanbu Regional Environmental Center (Transfer Station), Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town)

It is not necessary to use town-designated trash bags. However, please place strong-smelling or easily scattered waste in a bag when bringing it to these locations.

Use transparent or semi-transparent bags so that the contents are visible.

For self-delivery to the transfer station or Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town), a handling fee of 100 yen will be charged per 10 kg of waste.

Kitchen Waste (food scraps, shells, etc.)



- · Food scraps should be composted whenever possible.
- · Drain any excess liquid and securely tie the bag before disposal.
- · Cooking oil should be disposed of at the locations designated by the town. (For small amounts, absorb the oil with paper or cloth, or solidify it using a commercially available solidifying agent, and dispose of it as combustible (burnable) waste.)

Plastic / Rubber



- · Plastic items that are not containers or packaging should be disposed of as combustible (burnable) waste.
- · Items that are too large to fit into towndesignated trash bags should be disposed of as oversized combustible (burnable) waste. (See Page 11)
- · Cut hoses and ropes into 60 cm lengths or less before disposal.
- OWhen disposing of waste at the collection sites in each area, be sure to place it in town-designated trash bags for combustible (burnable) waste. (excluding disposable diapers)
- OFor self-delivery to the Chita-Nanbu Regional Environmental Center (Transfer Station) or Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town), it is not necessary to use town-designated trash bags for combustible (burnable) waste. However, strong-smelling or easily scattered waste must be placed in a bag. Use a transparent or semi-transparent bag to ensure the contents are visible.
- OFor inquiries about waste collection sites in each area, please contact the relevant division at the town hall.

Footwear / Bags



Sneakers, boots, etc.

- · Remove as many metal parts as possible and dispose of them as metal at the sorting sites.
- · Items that are too large to fit into towndesignated trash bags should be disposed of as oversized combustible (burnable) waste. (See Page 11)

Others



- Futons, etc., can be disposed of as combustible (burnable) waste at the waste collection sites in each area, as long as they fit in designated trash bags and meet the size requirements. Items that do not fit in town-designated trash bags should be disposed of as oversized combustible (burnable) waste. (See Page 11)
- · For paint, absorb it with paper or cloth and dispose of it as combustible (burnable) waste.
- · Unused fireworks or matches should be soaked in water before disposal.
- · For disposable hand warmers, open the packaging and dispose of them after the heat has completely dissipated.
- · For ink cartridges, please use the collection boxes available at the town hall or at local stores.

Disposable Diapers

- · Used adult and child diapers should be placed in commercially available transparent or semi-transparent bags, labeled 「紙お むつ], and disposed of at the waste collection sites in each
- *Not applicable to pet diapers.
- *For self-delivery to the Chita-nanbu Regional Environmental Center (Transfer Station) or Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town), a handling fee of 100 yen will be charged for every 10 kg of waste.

Bean Bags



- · To prevent bursting or scattering during transportation by the waste collection truck, please place the bead cushions in town-designated trash bags, label them [ビーズクッション], and dispose of them at the waste collection sites.
- · Do not dispose of them in bags other than the designated
- · Self-delivery is also possible at the Chita-nanbu Regional Environmental Center (Transfer Station) or Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town).
- · Items that are too large to fit into town-designated trash bags should be disposed of as oversized combustible (burnable) waste. (See Page 11)

Grass / Pruned Branches / Bamboo (Combustible (burnable) Waste)

Either place the waste in a town-designated trash bag or wrap it with a 45-liter towndesignated trash bag, and dispose of it at the waste collection sites in each area on combustible (burnable) waste collection days.

Transfer Station, Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town)

For self-delivery to the transfer station or Yumekurin (within Taketoyo Town), a handling fee of 100 yen will be charged for every 10 kg of waste.

Packaging Requirements for Disposal at Waste Collection Sites in Each Area

Place waste in the town-designated trash bags.




Wrap with a town-designated trash bag (applicable only to pruned branches).



*Bamboo or bamboo grass can only be disposed of at the waste collection sites in town-designated trash bags if they are within the size limit (60 cm in length).

- OWhen disposing of grass, leaves, bamboo, etc., as combustible (burnable) waste at the waste collection sites in each area, please place them in town-designated trash bags.
- OFor pruned branches, ensure they are within the size limit stated above and wrap them in a 45-liter towndesignated trash bag before disposal.

Packaging Requirements for Self-Delivery to the Chita-nanbu Region Environmental Center (Transfer Station)



- OFor self-delivery to the Transfer Station, using town-designated trash bags is not required. However, to prevent scattering, the waste should be placed in a commercially available bag or tied with string before being dropped off. A handling fee of 100 yen will be charged for every 10 kg of waste.
- OPruned branches or bamboo that exceed the specified size should be disposed of as oversized combustible (burnable) waste. (See Page 11)

Things to note when self-delivering to the Chita-nanbu Clean Center (Stockyard)

- OWhen dropping off waste at the Chita-nanbu Clean Center (Stockyard), there is no need to place it in bags or tie it with string.
- OSeparate "grass and leaves," "branches and wood, "and "bamboo and bamboo grass" when dropping off waste. Mixed categories cannot be recycled and will be treated as combustible (burnable) or oversized combustible (burnable) waste.
- OFor wood or bamboo, remove any branches or bamboo grass before drop-off.
- The maximum size for self-delivery is 180 cm in length and 15 cm in thickness (diameter).
- OTo ensure proper recycling, do not include non-recyclable items such as combustible (burnable) waste, cans, soil, or sand. Additionally, remove any bags, boxes, or cords used for transport, as these are considered foreign materials.
- OVegetables (edible parts) and flowers (flower petals) contain high moisture and decompose easily, making them unsuitable for recycling. Flower seeds may interfere with the process due to sprouting. Please dispose of these as combustible (burnable) waste.
- OCertain types of plants may not be accepted.



- · Items with the "paper" symbol (such as snack boxes), as well as wrapping paper, notepads, shredded paper, carbon paper, and plastic-coated or synthetic paper (such as calendars and posters), are also accepted.
- *Documents fastened with staples or clips, as well as leaflets in plastic bags, can be disposed of as they are.
- *If concerned about personal information, ensure it cannot be read before disposal.
- *Paper with strong scents, such as detergent or incense boxes, is also accepted for disposal.



Chita-nanbu Clean Center (Recycling Station)

Place waste in the town-designated trash bags and dispose of it at the waste collection sites in your area on the designated collection day. Place items in the town-designated trash bags. Items can be dropped off even on rainy days.



Empty all contents.

Rinse with water to remove any residue.

Place items directly into the designated trash bag without double-bagging.

Do not mix in anything other than plastic containers and packaging!

Including foreign objects makes recycling impossible. Items such as knives, glass, or flammable and hazardous waste can cause injuries to workers and accidents at processing facilities. To prevent disruptions in sorting operations, do not use double bags.



Measurements not exceeding 250cm(H)×150cm(W)×100cm(D) *For trees and wood, the thickness (diameter) must be 20cm or less.



*Electric blankets and heated carpets are accepted as oversized waste due to the processing required for internal heating wires.

OA handling fee of 100 yen will be charged for every 10 kg of waste.

- OThis waste is processed by the Chita-nanbu Region Environmental Association and follows the same measurement and payment system as oversized incombustible (non-burnable) waste. However, oversized wooden items and oversized recyclable (see Page 13), managed by the Chita-nanbu Public Health Association, are weighed and charged separately.
- Olf oversized combustible (burnable) waste is mixed with oversized wooden items or oversized recyclable (see Page 13), it will require separate weighing and payment.
- Oltems that are not properly sorted or exceed the accepted size limits will not be accepted.
- ODepending on the material or shape, the item may not be accepted for disposal.



- OThis waste is processed by the Chita-nanbu Region Environmental Association and follows the same measurement and payment system as oversized combustible (burnable) waste. However, oversized wooden items and oversized recyclable (see Page 13), managed by the Chita-nanbu Public Health Association, are weighed and charged separately.
- Olf oversized incombustible (non-burnable) waste is mixed with oversized wooden items or oversized recyclable (see Page 13), it will require separate weighing and payment.
- Oltems that are not properly sorted or exceed the accepted size limits will not be accepted.



- OThis waste is processed by the Chita-nanbu Public Health Association. Oversized combustible (burnable) waste and oversized incombustible (non-burnable) waste (see Pages 11, 12), managed by the Chita-nanbu Region Environmental Association, are weighed and charged separately.
- Olf oversized wooden items or oversized recyclable is mixed with oversized combustible (burnable) waste and oversized incombustible (non-burnable) waste (see Pages 11, 12), it will require separate weighing and payment.
- Oltems that are not properly sorted or exceed the accepted size limits will not be accepted.
- OFor items that use fuel, please ensure all fuel is completely used up before disposal.
- ODepending on the material or shape, the item may not be accepted for disposal.





- OA handling fee of 100 yen will be charged for every 10 kg of waste.
- OThe maximum acceptable size is generally up to two concrete blocks (40cm×40cm×20cm).
- OThe maximum allowable amount is approximately half the capacity of a small truck (around 175 kg). Continuous disposal is not allowed.
- OConstruction debris or waste from renovations (including DIY work using heavy machinery or specialized equipment) will not be accepted.
- OGypsum board and products containing gypsum cannot be accepted as they may release dangerous gases (such as hydrogen sulfide) during disposal.
- Oltems may not be accepted based on material, shape, quantity, or reason for disposal. Examples: Millstones, octopus pots, reinforced concrete, etc.

Disposal of Unwanted Soil and Stones from Households —

Soil and stones that are no longer needed due to gardening or yard maintenance are considered natural materials and not classified as "waste." However, they may be accepted if they meet the above criteria.


Please dispose of waste on the designated collection day for each area. However, paper and fabric (including clothing) cannot be disposed of on rainy days, as moisture can interfere with the recycling process.

Chita-nanbu Clean Center (Recycling Station)

Items can be brought directly to the Chitananbu Clean Center (Recycling Station). All items are accepted even on rainy days.

Glass Bottles (for food, beverages, or cosmetics) 1.8-liter bottles (green, brown) Beer bottles Reusable bottles Clear and transparent Brown bottles Other colored bottles


- OEmpty the contents and rinse briefly with water.
- OLabels do not need to be removed from reusable bottles.
- OBottle caps should be disposed of as "metal".
- OBottles that previously contained hazardous substances, such as chemicals, should be rinsed and disposed of as "glass and ceramics".
- OBottles with stubborn stains that cannot be removed should also be disposed of as "glass and ceramics".



- OTo prevent fires or explosions during the handling process, ensure that spray cans and gas canisters are completely emptied before disposal. There is no need to puncture them.
- Olf the nozzle of a spray can cannot be removed, dispose of it with the nozzle attached.
- OAluminum and steel cans should be emptied and rinsed briefly with water. Lids should be disposed of as "metal".



- OOnly bottles marked with the "PET" symbol and used for food or beverages are accepted. ORinse briefly with water.
- OCaps and labels must be removed and disposed of as plastic containers and packaging. (See Page 10)
- OThe bottles cannot be recycled together with plastic containers and packaging.
- OWater dispenser bottles cannot be recycled.
 Please check with the retailer or dispose of them as combustible (burnable) waste.



- Olnserts can be disposed of together with newspapers.
- ORemove metal fasteners, tape, and plastic before disposing of cardboard.
- ODirty clothing should be washed before disposal. If washing is not possible, dispose of it as combustible (burnable) waste.
- OWorkwear and traditional Japanese clothing (e.g., kimonos) cannot be recycled. Dispose of them as combustible (burnable) waste.
- OOnly paper cartons with a white interior can be recycled. Rinse, dry, and flatten them before disposal. OPaper cartons with a silver (aluminum-coated) interior should be disposed of as mixed paper.
- OWhen disposing of paper or fabric (clothing) at sorting sites on designated collection days, ensure they are bundled to a manageable thickness and tied securely in a cross pattern. Do not dispose of them on rainy days; instead, wait for the next collection day.
- OPaper and fabric (clothing) can be brought directly to the Chita-nanbu Clean Center (Recycling Station) even on rainy days. Cardboard, paper cartons, and fabric (clothing) do not need to be tied in a cross pattern when brought to the facility.






Oltems too large to fit into the sorting collection container (approx.30cm(H)× 40cm(W)×30cm(D)) cannot be disposed of as recyclable waste (other).

OFluorescent tubes and umbrellas are exceptions and can be disposed of even if they exceed the container size.

OFor umbrellas, remove the fabric or vinyl covering before disposal.

OFor lighters, ensure they are completely emptied of gas before disposal to prevent fire hazards during the handling process.



OLithium-ion batteries removed from small household appliances should be disposed of as dry batteries. ONon-combustible (non-burnable) waste refers to items made from mixed materials. E.g., eyeglasses with lenses (glass) + frames (plastic/metal)

OFor sharp objects, to prevent accidents during transportation and handling, wrap the blade with cloth or tape before disposing of it as non-combustible (non-burnable) waste.

Olf an item is made up of at least 90% metal, it should be disposed of as "metal".


For items listed under the Home Appliance Recycling Law, disposal should be arranged through a home appliance retailer or the store where a replacement is being purchased. For more details, visit the Association for Electric Home



Please consult a retailer or disposal company for proper disposal of these items.



Car parts and accessories are not accepted. Please consult with a retailer.



Industrial waste generated by the fishing industry is not accepted. Please consult with either the fishing association or a disposal company.




Items made from fiberglass-reinforced plastic (FRP) are not accepted.



Pachinko or slot machines, even those used in households, are not accepted.



Industrial waste generated by the agricultural industry is not accepted. Please consult with either the agricultural center or a disposal company.




Items such as fireproof safes, which are difficult to process, are not accepted. Please consult with a retailer.



Items that contain piano wire, which are difficult to process, are not accepted. Please consult with a retailer.



Engine-powered machines are not accepted. Please consult with a retailer. (Except for handheld lawnmowers.)



Electric water heaters are not accepted. Please consult with a retailer.



Construction waste materials (both business and private use) are not accepted.

★Please consider contacting a licensed waste disposal company within the town for collection.

Illegal Dumping is a Crime!

- If illegal dumping occurs on your property, report it to the police before cleaning it up and consult the relevant department at the town hall.
- Regardless of whether a report is made, if the person responsible for illegal dumping cannot be identified, the landowner is legally required to dispose of the waste.

*Please note that even if a report is made, the police or town hall will not clean up waste on private property.
